Ten Ways to Pray for our Church Michelle S. Lazurek

If you are someone who prays regularly, you may pray about current events, your unsaved friends and other pressing issues during your prayer time. But how often do you pray for your church? Here are some ways you can keep your church at the top of vour prayer list:

Vision

Where there is no revelation, people cast off restraint; but blessed is the one who heeds wisdom's instruction. Proverbs 29:18

Think of a church like a ship sailing in the ocean. Without a strong leader steering the ship with a clear sense of where it is going and weathering potential storms, the ship will easily veer off course. Pastors and leaders must agree on a vision for the church and have the necessary resources to achieve that vision. Pray that the church's vision is Christ centered and will help the church achieve and maintain success in five or ten years from now.

Direction

And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young me will see visions. Joel 2:28

Without dreams and vision, churches lack direction. Without a sense of direction, church members also become bored and feel as though they have no purpose within the body. Pray for clear direction.

Mission

In addition to vision, churches must have a mission, or the steps the church will take to achieve its mission. Pray that the church will clarify and clearly communicate this mission to all its members and that it will remain the church's focus.

Elders

The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching. 1 Timothy 5:17

Next to the pastor, a church must have a good board of leaders who stand behind and support the pastor. Pray that they share the pastor's vision, handle conflicts so the pastor doesn't have to and communicate the mission and vision to church members often so members are constantly reminded of a church's values and mission.

Pastor

A pastor's job never ends. They never stop giving. Between long hours, insufficient pay and additional spiritual warfare, pastors need all the prayers they can get. Pray for protection over he and his family, and that God will use him mightily to preach the good news to all those who hear him.

New wine into new wineskins

Neither do people pour new wine into old wineskins. If they do, the skins will burst; the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. No, they pour new wine into new wineskins, and both are preserved. Matthew 9:17

Dead churches are ones in which long standing church members try to recreate the success of past ministries without considering the church's values and goals for the future. Pray that all servants will not pour old wine into new wineskins, but rather identify the church's biggest needs and do their best to meet them, putting their own needs and desires aside.

Good soil

But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart. who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop. Luke 8:15.

Mature to new believers alike fill pews week after week. But only the attendees who are good soil will apply what they have heard and make the world a better place because of it. Pray that churches have enough people who are good soil so that the seeds of truth will take root and grow into people who take the gospel to the ends of the earth world.

For prodigal sons and daughters to come home

When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired servants.' So he got up and went to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him. Luke 15: 17-20

The fact that younger generations are leaving the church at an alarming rate is nothing new. But because they are leaving now doesn't mean they can't return later. It took the prodigal son to come to his senses before he returned with a repentant heart. Pray that children who were raised in the faith will come to their senses and return to the faith later in their lives.

For the Holy Spirit to pour Himself out – Unity

"When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them." Acts 2:2-4

The disciples, particularly Peter, were never the same after the Holy Spirit came upon them at Pentecost. A dead church can be revitalized if they are working in conjunction with the Holy Spirit.

Guatemalan Project

HERE IS THE LATEST FROM OUR TEÂM IN GUATEMALA

In Guatemala, a new school year is beginning and Mission Guatemala's (Scholarships with a Mission) program is once again supporting students in pursuing their dreams of continuing their education! We are excited to welcome 29 new students to the scholarship program! These students join the 33 middle school and 29 high school students currently in the scholarship program, for a total of 91 students!

Students are selected for the "Becas" scholarship program on the basis of both their economic need and their grades in elementary school. The scholarship helps to cover the student's inscription fees and monthly tuition costs, as well as necessary school supplies and uniforms. As long as each student maintains their grades and meets other basic requirements of the program, Mission Guatemala will continue to support the students each year, beginning in middle school and continuing until they graduate from high school!

This program goes beyond simply helping to cover education expenses. Students in the program also receive free access to Mission Guatemala's medical clinic and are also able to participate in enriching, relationship-building activities and workshops organized throughout the year by our staff!

At the start of each year, we meet with each of the scholarship students and their parents to share the details of the program with them and so that they can sign a document accepting the scholarship and acknowledging the expectations and standards of the program.

Just a little bit goes a long way to help our children in Guatemala. They continue to applaud us for our support!

PB&J Mission

The need right now is more JELLY!

We have become the "Peanut Butter and Jelly Church". We are providing our collected goods to the FISH Food Pantry and they have indicated they are always in need of peanut butter and jelly.



We will keep track of our collection throughout the year as we did in 2023, and this will go towards our donation/missions numbers for the year. DUMC is an incredibly generous and caring church, and we are going to keep track of not only the PB&J donations, but all of the generous in kind donations that you all show all year, every year.

During WWII, the British used Monopoly games to help POWs escape.

Monopoly has been beloved for generations, but the history of the classic board game isn't all fun and games. During World War II, specially manufactured Monopoly boards were used to help prisoners of war escape from captivity. In 1940, the British government struck a deal with Waddingtons, the company that manufactured London-themed editions of Monopoly, in which MI9, a secret department of the War Office, tasked Waddingtons with creating a version of Monopoly that contained various tools and information to aid POWs in their potential escape efforts.

The sneakily altered Monopoly boards were distributed to Nazi-run POW camps as part of larger aid packages. In addition to the standard thimble and dog game pieces, each board contained metal "playing pieces" that were actually escape tools, such as a file and magnetic compass. Each version also contained silk maps provided by the intelligence agency, which could be unfolded discreetly without drawing attention. What's more, these special editions swapped out fake Monopoly money for real German, Italian, and French currency that could be used to bribe guards. The British government also contracted game company John Jaques & Son to create chess sets and versions of Snakes and Ladders that contained hidden compartments with escape tools.

God Finds Us Usable

Isn't it amazing to think that the God of the Universe finds us usable. He's given us specific gifts and abilities for reaching out to others. He could have chosen a thousand other ways to reach the unsaved, but the Lord picked us! Thank you for your service to our church.

A Prayer to Remember God Makes Everything Beautiful

"Yet God has made everything beautiful for its own time." Ecclesiastes 3:11

Everything is beautiful in its time.

I can remember a time when a verse like this would cause much frustration. I would read this verse in a time of despair and think, "Lord, how could you make *this* beautiful?" How could a moment of loss, tragedy, or abandonment ever be seen in a positive light? This was especially true a few years ago.

In 2017, it felt like everything was falling apart. My father-in-law had passed away, my church friends had all become foes, and my husband was battling chronic illness. During all this, I was pregnant. Although that was a joyous occasion, birthing something new amidst a sea of pain was not an enjoyable experience. Yet, I could not help but remind myself, "One day, the Lord will make this beautiful." One day, the Lord would show His glory through it all.

I believe this feeling was also shared by the lame man in John 5. Though this man remains nameless, the Bible says he'd been in a paralyzed condition for 38 years. In the passage in John 5:1-5, we see a man who was desperate to be healed to no avail. It is believed that the very place he laid at the Sheep Gate pool would be where angels would come at certain times, stir up the waters, and bring healing. All that was required was to be the first in the water. So, for many years the man was strategically placed to be set free from his condition. Unfortunately, time and time again, he was overlooked, stepped over, and was never able to be the first in the pool. In just reading the words found in John, we can feel the agony and frustration he must have felt. I am certain, he would wrestle with the phrase, "He makes everything beautiful." Sometimes disappointment can make us doubt God's great plan!

I am so happy that the story doesn't end here.

When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been in that condition a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." And immed-iately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked. John 5:6-9

In an instant, with a single sentence, Jesus changed the trajectory of his life. He went from one who was in desperate need to one who was fully healed! His life has become a testimony for the many who had ignored him and tossed him aside for their own gain. God truly made it all beautiful in His time. He was a living, breathing, walking testimony of God's goodness!

Today, I want to encourage you with the words we find in Ecclesiastes 3:11, "He makes all things beautiful." You may feel disappointed or discou-raged now. You may not understand why things have unfolded the way they have in your life.

Yet, here's what we know to be true, we serve a God who loves His child-ren. He sees all and He knows all. He is all-powerful and He has not forgot-ten you.

In 2017, I experienced this as the Lord brought complete healing to my husband, rectified our ministry woes, and allowed us to birth a beautiful baby girl named Heavenly Joy. And for the man we find in John 5, we see that his thirty-eight years of pain have turned into a testimony that over 2,000 years later we can still rejoice about. God truly does turn things around. Let us not grow weary in the wait.

I thank you for your limitless wisdom. I thank you for writing my story. Although I may not always understand why things are happening, you do. You go before me and keep me even in my darkest hours. I thank you for using my moments of sadness as a starting point for a miracle to take place. Help me to embrace your process for me. Thank you, Lord, that you make all broken things new and beautiful.
