

Pastor said he appreciated the church. Then he announced that he had been permanently appointed as Pastor of Darlington UMC. We were asked the questions: "Why does this church exist? Prior to Charge Conference the Trustees will inspect the parsonage. They will also check to see if there needs to be any Preventive Maintenance (PM"s) done to the furnaces of the church.

With no other business to discuss, the meeting was closed with prayer.

All of the workshops were led by local psychologists.

Feminine Hygiene


These items need be small travel sizes please.
