## Of Shepherd's Sharing: The BLUSTERY DAYS OF WINTER

As I sit and type this letter, it is the coldest day of the winter season with temperatures far below zero and windchills dangerously low. I wondered if there was any benefit to the cold. Here is what I found...

- Colder air boosts your brain activity, improves focus, and helps you think more clearly.
- Exercising outdoors in the winter makes our heart muscles stronger because they work harder to pump blood and maintain the body's temperature and our endurance improves, good things.
- When it comes to sleep, the body's core temp naturally drops—a
  process that can take up to two hours in the heat of summer and is
  much faster in winter. Winter means shorter days (darker mornings
  and early evenings), causing us to produce more melatonin allowing
  for better rest.
- Lastly, cold temperatures (and cold water) keep your skin-tight, vibrant, and radiant.

Many people find themselves in a spiritual winter, a season which is dark, cold, and lonely.

Just like the cold can provide us with health benefits, so can a season in our lives where things are difficult. How do you know if your soul is in the midst of a winter? Here are some indicators.

- When things that used to give you joy, now make you feel exhausted.
- What used to facilitate growth in God now feels dry.
- All your efforts seem to not produce any good fruit.
- Your prayers lack life and seem one-sided and it's hard to pray out loud or read the Bible.

Your work or family life has you going crazy and you crave stillness.

God created the seasons in life for a reason. He knew that some plants needed a season of not bearing fruit, a time when they could go dormant and allow the roots to grow deeper, so when the season came to grow fruit again happened, the tree/plant would be stronger, healthier and able to be used. It is the same way with our souls. Try to utilize these practices to help you if you find yourself in the midst of a wintery season spiritually.

Sabbath - The sabbath is for remembering, with gratefulness, what the Lord has given you.

**Solitude** - Learn to be alone. Schedule a coffee date with Jesus and leave your phone at home. We should "be present to God in the silence so that you can be present to people in the noise."

**Confession** – The pruning of winter may mean we need to offer forgiveness to declutter resentment.

Psalms 130:5 says, "I wait for the Lord, my whole being waits, and in his word I put my hope."

Winter offers us a chance to have roots that grow stronger and deeper. It gives us the ability to see the security and hope that comes from knowing the Lord your God will come through!

May you find yourself warmed by the renewing of your mind, heart and soul this winter.

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## **Praying for Unity**

These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus and with His brothers. Acts 1:14

There was a time when there was only one Christian church. It was the church in Jerusalem, and immediately after Christ's ascension, it appears to have had 120 members (Acts 1:15). By contrast, today there are more than 40,000 Christian denominations in the world.

The most striking difference between the first church and today's worldwide church is that they were all of "one accord in prayer" (Acts 1:14). Jesus had told them to wait in Jerusalem for the gift of the Holy Spirit, so that was likely the focus on their prayer (Acts 1:4). But after the Spirit came at Pentecost, their unity in prayer continued as they chose a replacement for Judas Iscariot and chose men to assist the apostles in serving the church (Acts 1:24-25; 6:1-6). Jesus had made unity among His followers a matter of His own prayer (John 17:20-21).

It is to be expected that human beings, even Christians, will differ in their ideas. But the goal of unity through prayer is always the highest priority. If there is "one body and one Spirit" (and there is – Ephesians 4:4), unity should be the result.

Here are just a few highlights of the past year that your generosity has made possible.

- <u>Medical Clinic:</u> Over 3600 patients have been treated with loving, respectful and quality medical care, with over 5300 lab tests being run in our on-site laboratory!
- <u>Nutrition Programs:</u> 132 children aged 6 months to 6 years received nutritional support and specialized treatment from our clinic doctor! Parents have also been provided health and nutrition workshops throughout the year.
- <u>Education Support:</u> 81 students of the 91 that began 2024 in our middle and high school scholarship program will successfully complete the year of study and 13 will graduate high school! In our "Kematz'ib" computer academy, 117 students have been enrolled in computer classes and 33 will graduate this year!
- <u>Community Improvement:</u> In 2024, we welcomed 19 teams from 10 states to serve with us in Guatemala!

# **Pluto Day**

Pluto Day is celebrated annually on February 18 to commemorate the anniversary of the discovery of Pluto in 1930. The planet, known for its characteristic icy mountains and tiny size was discovered by American astronomer Clyde Tombaugh and, up until 2006, was considered one of the nine planets in the solar system together with Mercury, Venus, our current planet of Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune. Clyde discovered Pluto at the Lowell Observatory in Flagstaff, Arizona just 84 years after the discovery of Neptune.

### History of Pluto Day

Pluto Day is celebrated annually to commemorate the anniversary of the discovery of Pluto in 1930. Although Pluto was discovered in 1930, the story of its discovery started in 1840 after French astronomer Urbain Le Verrier sensed that there was a planet outside of Uranus due to irregularities in its orbit. His intuition led him to develop mathematical calculations to explain the discrepancies of Uranus's orbit in relation to the laws of planetary motion and gravity, which led to the eventual discovery of Neptune.

After Neptune was discovered, an event that is widely regarded as a validation of a subset of the astronomy practice called celestial mechanics. It was then realized that there was yet another planet disturbing Uranus's orbit since the irregularity in its orbit continued. This then led to the search for Pluto — initially called Planet X — being headed by Percival Lowell, whose death would later see the search for Pluto passed to Clyde Tombaugh, who eventually discovered it.

The planet, which was named after the Roman god of the Underworld, was considered one of the nine planets in the solar system up until 2006. The International Astronomical Union reduced its status and tagged it a 'dwarf' planet due to not meeting the criteria to be considered a full-sized planet and being two-third of the size of the earth. It is believed that the first two letters in 'Pluto' were in honor of Percival Lowell whose belief that there were other planets beyond Neptune, helped fuel the drive that led to its discovery.
