Of Shepherd's Sharing: Let the Bells Ring January 2025

This past year I had the privilege to travel to Switzerland for a couple of weeks. I loved so many different parts of this great nation, but I believe one of the most impactful things was every day, twice a day, I would hear the bells ring at 7 am and 6 pm from the nearest church. They would ring for a long time it seemed. Beautiful melodies of bells chiming in unison made such a happy sound to me. I just couldn't help but smile as they played. The ringing of the bells was a reminder that God was with me and that the church was not far away.

Pastor Esther and I talked about the beauty of the sound and the significance of the reminder of God being with us and the Holy Spirit led us as we sat and laid out the ministry calendar for the next year, to have the theme...LET THE BELLS RING!

In the Bible, bells symbolize holiness. It is the Christian churches equivalent of Israel's military trumpets, where were used for signaling and assembling. There is also the practical side of bells being used for musical purposes.

The bells ringing are a great reminder that God is with us all...always!

In Isaiah 9:6, the prophet Isaiah rang the bells of Heaven and proclaimed that God would be known as "Wonderful Counsellor, The Mighty God. The Everlasting Father. The Prince of Peace." And these are all so true! God is all of these and more.

As we enter into a New Year together, I pray that two things can happen for each of you:

- 1. That you can hear the bells ringing all year long and take each moment and remember to give God praise and thanks. That you find ways to deepen your faith walk and journey.
- That you find ways to ring the bells of your faith so that others may see and hear God through you. This may be done by actions, or words, but the important thing is that we allow the Holy Spirit to use us on this journey.

Eventually we all will hear the bell ring one last time, when we are called "home" at the conclusion of our race here on earth.

It used to be that every church had a church bell. But over time, this has gone away. When sharing my vision for this coming year, there was some "noise" that we may have to come up with a way to "ring the bell" so the community knows we are here. I don't know exactly how this will end up looking. But keep your ears open! You may just very well find yourself hearing the bells ring!

And when you do hear the bells ring...remember to thank God for the gift you have in your life.

Praying 2025 brings you all much joy and happiness.

The Five Fingers of Prayer

- Your thumb is nearest to you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C. S. Lewis once said, a "sweet duty."
- 2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct, and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3. The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger; as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble, or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray too much.
- 5. And lastly comes our little finger; the smallest finger of all, which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you." Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.

Remember 1 Thessalonians 5:17 says to "pray without ceasing."

C. S. Lewis

November 29, 1898 - November 22, 1963

Clive Staples Lewis was born in Belfast, Ireland, in 1898 to a family of avid readers. Lewis, too, was soon immersed in literature: He started reading at just 3 years old, and by age 5, he had begun writing stories about a fantasy land populated by "dressed animals."



Years later, a 19-year-old Lewis served in World War 1 with the Somerset Light infantry. He experienced trench warfare on the front line in the Somme, the horrors of which he carried with him for the rest of his life.

Lewis first met J.R.R. Tolkien in 1926, and the two men developed a lifelong friendship. Lewis, who had become an atheist early in life, found his way back to theism and Christianity under Tolkien's guidance Tolkien, meanwhile, openly credited Lewis as a major source of creative encouragement: "Only from him," wrote Tolkien, "did I ever get the idea that my 'stuff' could be more than a private hobby. But for his interest and unceasing eagerness for more I should never have brought *The Lord of the Rings* to a conclusion."

Lewis himself was a prolific writer of both fiction and nonfiction. The latter included books and essay of Christian apologetics in which he passionately promotes and defends Christianity. Chrisitan themes are also highly prevalent in his works of popular fiction which include *The Screwtape Letters, The Space Trilogy,* and most famously, *The Chronicles of Narnia.*

Feminine Hygiene These items need be small travel sizes please. Thank you for your help.


Bottle Caps for Benches

Guatemalan Project



Here are just a few highlights of the past year that your generosity has made possible.

- <u>Medical Clinic:</u> Over 3600 patients have been treated with loving, respectful and quality medical care, with over 5300 lab tests being run in our on-site laboratory!
- <u>Nutrition Programs:</u> 132 children aged 6 months to 6 years received nutritional support and specialized treatment from our clinic doctor! Parents have also been provided health and nutrition workshops throughout the year.
- <u>Education Support:</u> 81 students of the 91 that began 2024 in our middle and high school scholarship program will successfully complete the year of study and 13 will graduate high school! In our "Kematz'ib" computer academy, 117 students have been enrolled in computer classes and 33 will graduate this year!
- <u>Community Improvement:</u> In 2024, we welcomed 19 teams from 10 states to serve with us in Guatemala!

But even as we celebrate all that has happened in 2024, our work is not finished! **With your support**, Mission Guatemala will continue to love and serve our neighbors here in Guatemala in the coming year!
